SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

It is a government legal requirement that all children attend school for 190 days. It is also a government requirement that we monitor attendance and apply the legal requirement.

We recognise that good attendance is crucial to raising standards and pupil attainment. Research shows that children who have a high level of school attendance do better in tests and exams, develop better friendships and are happier in school. When children are missing school they are missing out!

St Anne's is striving to achieve a target of 97.5% whole school attendance. Please help us to reach this target.

Ways you can help...

- Please do not book holiday during term time. There are 12 weeks of school holiday during every school year. As you will be aware, the school has very limited power to authorise holiday requests unless there are exceptional circumstances. All requests for leave must be made on the official forms and these can be collected from the school office. You will then receive a response from the school informing you to whether the absence will be authorised or not. If the absence is unauthorised please be aware it could trigger a local authority fine.
- Please book medical appointments out of school hours whenever possible.
- Please send your child to school unless they are genuinely unwell. Coughs, colds, sore throats and tiredness are NOT acceptable reasons for absence.
