Curriculum focus of PPG spending in 2014/15

For children to make expected or better progress in numeracy, reading and writing

To raise the self-esteem of children in need of positive reinforcement and pastoral guidance

For children to receive the same opportunities as others in terms of music tuition, school trips, equipment/uniform and extra- curricular activities

Measuring the impact of PPG spending

e.g. The school will evaluate the impact on each pupil at the end of the autumn term. Evaluation will focus on academic gains and how pupils' self-confidence has developed as a consequence of the intervention.

100% received TA support

100% achieved expected or better attainment in reading

75% achieved expected or better attainment in writing (those who didn't were SEN or EAL or both)

94% achieved expected or better attainment in maths (1 child also SEN)

57% of children requested and received music tuition

100% of the children attended school trips & took part in extra-curricular activities

27% of the children took part in 'Turnabout' / Positive Play

16% of the children received 1:1 tutor support
